Statement from the Joint Women's Health Care Caucus Mourning the Death of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg

The ability of women to participate equally in the economic and social life of the Nation has been facilitated by their ability to control their reproductive lives. These are guiding words for the Joint Women's Healthcare Caucus, co-chaired by Senator Barbara Favola and Delegate Kaye Kory, as well as a key point in Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg's forceful dissent in the Hobby Lobby case.
